

Oregon Divisional Chainsaw Sculpture Championships

June 12-15, 2008

We want everyone to have a good time and enjoy the Oregon Coast . As coordinators of this event we try to have minimal rules. To minimize questions we put the most frequently observed problems in writing to minimize anyone getting upset.

Rules to follow

1. We ask that all carvers wear proper protection while carving. This would include chaps, ear, eye and foot protection.
2. The main sculpture is to be made entirely from the block of wood that you choose.
3. The Reedsport competition allows power tools to be used, although the sculptures must be blocked out with a chain saw.
4. Quick carves are to be sold as one lot. If you are able to make two bears in the quick carve they will be sold as a pair, not individually.
5. Quick carve wood should be picked out and sitting on your site at the beginning of the day. If you need help contact a staff member.
6. No stenciling or marking your wood for the quick carves until the whistle blows to start.
7. You must be competing in the main event to be eligible for quick carve prize money and prizes. However, your donations are always appreciated.
8. During the contest, including quick carves, you may have a helper handing you tools, cleaning up, and fueling saws. No helper is to touch the carving.
9. Add on items such as plastic eyes, fishing poles, etc., that is carver supplied, may not make up more than an estimated 5 percent of the quick carve. (It's okay to bring a fish to tie on fishing pole, but you can not bring a boat to sit the bear in.)
10. All carvings must be removed from the competition area by Sunday night. Any carving left on site is at your own risk.
11. Please use saws and equipment with safety features that have not been modified.
